The University of Delhi is one of the premier Institutes of the Country with a venerable legacy and international acclaim for the highest academic standards, diverse educational programs, distinguished faculty, illustrious alumni, varied co-curricular activities and state of art infrastructure. Over the many years of its existence, the University has sustained the highest Global standards and best practices in higher education. IMPORTANT POINTS

1. Admission to the Post Graduate (PG) Merit Based Programs is done on the basis of the eligibility criteria and procedures specified by the University on its website and Post Graduate Merit Based Bulletin of Information - 2023.
2. Admissions to the PG Merit Based Programs at the University of Delhi (UoD) will be based on the MERIT scores obtained in the qualifying degree examination.
3. Candidates must have passed the qualifying degree examination during the time of admission to the PG Merit Based Programs.
4. Prior to online registration, the candidate is advised to read the Bulletin of Information (BOI) carefully and consult the University of Delhi Act, 1922 and the Statutes. The Ordinances, Rules, and Regulations of the UoD, available on the University website, would be binding on him/ her.
5. It is mandatory for the candidate to register online in the Admission portal of UoD (<https://admission.uod.ac.in>). Registration through any other mode will not be accepted under any circumstances.
6. Candidates are advised to ascertain that they fulfill the Minimum Eligibility Criteria.
7. Merit will be based solely on the percentage of scores obtained in the qualifying degree examination as per the program specific eligibility criteria.
8. Candidates belonging to SC/ST/OBC-NCL/EWS/PwBD/CW will have to upload a valid certificate/document while applying. The name of the Candidate claiming reservation must match the Candidate's name as it appears on his/her corresponding School Board qualifying certificates. Similarly, the parents' names must also match in the certificates.
9. Gap year will not be a bar for the purpose of admission to postgraduate programs in UoD.
10. As per Ordinance - I of the University, there is no minimum age bar for admission to these Postgraduate Programs in the University.
11. As per A.C. Resolution 40 dated 24 / 04 / 1997 of the University of Delhi, no student of the University is permitted to pursue two degree programs simultaneously either from the University of Delhi or from other universities. However, he/she may pursue part-time diplomas / certificate programs offered by the University Departments / Centers / Colleges, if eligible. Candidates must check the website for all updates.
12. Candidates are advised to regularly check the admission website for any updates and grievances. Any grievance pertaining to the candidate's lack of awareness of the published information and updates will not be entertained.

Minimum Eligibility*

For candidates belonging to UR/OBC-NCL/EWS category, the minimum eligibility is 50% marks aggregate or equivalent grade in the qualifying examination as per the Program-Specific Eligibility.

For candidates belonging to SC/ST/PwBD category, the minimum eligibility is 45% marks in aggregate or equivalent grade in the qualifying examination as per the Program-Specific Eligibility.

REGISTRATION PROCESS

1. All the candidates seeking admission to the PG Merit Based programs 2023 must register online.
2. Online Registration details are available at: <http://www.admission.uod.ac.in>
3. A first-time user, in order to apply for a program, must register in the Admission Portal (www.uod.admission.ac.in). Using a valid e-mail ID, s(he) can register and generate login details by clicking on - New User Registration button.
4. Candidates who do not have a valid e-mail ID must create an e-mail ID before proceeding.
5. In the 'Login details', every candidate will furnish his/ her personal details (strictly as given in his / her original certificates), e-mail ID and mobile number (10 digit number without any prefix), which will be used for future correspondence, and also create a password (of minimum six characters).
6. Please ascertain that all the details given in the form are complete and correct, as the same will be used throughout the admission procedure and subsequently after Admission too.
7. The candidate needs to keep both USERNAME (e-mail ID) and PASSWORD handy because it will be required to access his / her account on the portal as well as for all the future correspondence throughout the admission process.
8. The candidate is required to re-login to the portal using 'USERNAME', 'PASSWORD' or 'MOBILE NUMBER' and 'OTP' and complete the Registration Form. S(he) needs to upload the following items:
 - i. His/her Passport size Photograph (maximum size: 500 KB; Formats: JPG / JPEG / PNG).
 - ii. His/her Scanned Signature (maximum size: 500 KB; Formats: JPG / JPEG / PNG).
9. The candidate also needs to furnish details of his/her Identity Proof (with photograph) and is required to upload the scanned copy of the same. This can be any one of the following documents: Aadhaar Card (with photograph) / Voter's Identity Card / PAN Card / Passport / Driving License.
10. Candidates must enter the percentage of marks obtained in the qualifying degree examination. If the marks obtained is in CGPA, candidates must convert to equivalent percentage as per the CGPA score and CGPA scale.
11. There will be a One-time Registration fees for the PG Merit Based Programs as per the details given below:

12. The registration process for a particular program will be considered completed only after the realization of the registration fee for that particular program. The candidate must ensure that the registration fee is

submitted for each program s(he) is interested to apply. The admission portal (www.admission.uod.ac.in) is the only portal for accepting registration fee. The registration fee deposited via any other link or mode other than the payment link provided by UoD will not be considered under any circumstances.

13. A candidate who wishes to apply for more than one program must select additional programs in the same registration portal and fill the details required for each program. A candidate's consideration in any program will be subject to successful realization of the registration fee of that particular program.
14. The Registration Fee can be paid through any one of the available online payment options: Net Banking, Debit Card, Credit Card, and UPI.
15. Candidates are advised to check their dashboard, email, and admission website (www.admission.uod.ac.in) for all communications and updates related to admissions.
16. UoD will not be responsible for a candidate's lack of awareness of the admission guidelines, schedule, Eligibility Criteria, and other admission rules. It is the sole responsibility of the candidate to keep checking the dashboard, email and admission website of UoD regularly.

Candidates are advised to fill their forms carefully. No correction after the submission of the form will be allowed. Personal Details such as Name, Category, Gender, mobile number, email Id and details of the Bank Account once selected/entered at the time of Registration will not be changed in any circumstance. Registration Fee once deposited will not be refunded/ adjusted in any circumstances.

ADMISSION PROCESS

1. Candidates must register online through the PG merit Admission portal <https://pg-merit.uod.ac.in>.
2. Admission to the PG Merit Based programs will solely be based on the percentage of marks obtained in the qualifying degree examination.
3. The merit list/s published on the Admission website shall be adhered to by the Department/ Centre/ Institute of UoD.
4. The merit list for the UR category seats will comprise all candidates in order of merit. No one will be excluded from the same. In other words, the merit list for the Unreserved (UR) category will also include SC/ST/OBC-NCL/EWS/PwBD candidates, irrespective of category, if they meet the criterion of merit for the UR category. No candidate can be excluded from the UR category merit list just because the Candidate belongs to or has applied under SC/ST/OBC-NCL/EWS/PwBD. Discrimination on the basis of category/ caste is completely unlawful. The University of Delhi does not tolerate discrimination against any candidate/student on this basis. Strict action will be taken against any violations.
5. If candidates belonging to SC/ST/OBC-NCL/EWS/PwBD/CW/Orphan category do not have a valid certificate/ document issued by the respective issuing authority at the time of applying to PG Merit Based programs, they will not be considered for admission in the relevant category as claimed. (Refer to Annexure I & II for the list of documents required and format of certificates respectively).
6. In case the seats of Supernumerary quota/s remain vacant, the same will not be converted to any other Category.
7. In case of non-compliance with the requirements for admission, including non-submission of relevant documents and/or non-payment of Fee/s within the stipulated date and time, the candidate will lose his/her right to admission.
8. The candidate will be required to appear in person to verify the original documents as and when notified by the University/ Department/ Centre/ Institute.
9. It is the sole responsibility of the candidate to prove his/her eligibility for claiming reservation under any of the reserved categories (including PwBD, CW and Orphan). Candidates applying under SC/ST/OBC-NCL/EWS/CW/PwBD/Orphan categories will be required to upload the certificates/documents of the respective reserved category/sub-category issued by the Competent Issuing Authority (Refer to Annexure II).
10. If at any stage, documents submitted by the candidate relating to the admission are found to be fake/non-genuine and/or fabricated or in any other manner defective, the said candidate will not be given admission and if already admitted, admission will be canceled without any prior notice in this regard. If the same is found after completing the Program, his/her degree will be revoked, and appropriate legal action will be taken against him/her.
11. A candidate's participation in the admission process will be provisional. If, at any stage, it is found that eligibility requirements are not fulfilled, the admission, if granted, shall be cancelled ipso facto and appropriate legal action will be taken against such candidate. University will not refund Admission Fee in case any candidate is found ineligible at a later stage.
12. In the case of tie, preference will be given to the candidate having an earlier date of birth (as mentioned in the Class X certificate).

13. The University reserves the right to cancel the admission of any candidate who violates the rules and regulations laid down by the UoD.
14. It is further to be noted that a candidate's name in the Admission List alone does not mean that s(he) is admitted. Selected candidates are to pay online Admission Fee within the prescribed deadline and will be considered admitted provisionally.
15. The candidates who do not select the program or pay the online fees, for whatever reasons, within prescribed deadline for a given Admission List shall NOT be considered for admission in any subsequent lists.
16. For the final approval of the admission, the candidate shall have to physically get the original certificates verified at the Department/ Centre/ Institute within the stipulated time as declared by the University, as and when announced by the University.

Bachelor's Degree from any recognized University in India or a foreign University with at least 50% marks along with a one year (full-time) Post-graduate Intensive Advanced Diploma Course in Chinese conducted by the University of Delhi or a UGC recognized University.

OR

Bachelor's Degree in Chinese from any recognized University in India or a foreign University with a minimum of 15 years of education with a minimum of 50% marks in the aggregate or equivalence course in Chinese.

RESERVATION POLICIES

RESERVATION OF SEATS FOR SCHEDULED CASTE (SC) AND SCHEDULED TRIBE (ST) CANDIDATES

22.5% of the total number of seats are reserved for Candidates belonging to Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribes (15% for Scheduled Caste and 7.5% for Scheduled Tribes, interchangeable if necessary).

The Candidate must be in possession of the Caste/Tribe certificate in his/her own name at the time of Registration and Admission. The Caste certificate should clearly state:

- (a) Name of his/ her caste/tribe
- (b) Whether candidate belongs to SC or ST
- (c) District and the State or Union Territory of Candidate's usual place of residence, and
- (d) The appropriate Govt. of India Schedule under which his /her caste/ tribe is approved as SC or ST.

Candidate will have to produce the valid original SC or ST caste/ tribe certificate at the time of admission. The following are empowered to issue the requisite SC/ ST certificate:

- a. District Magistrate / Additional District Magistrate / Collector / Deputy Commissioner / Addl. Deputy Commissioner / Deputy Collector / 1st class Stipendiary Magistrate / City Magistrate / Sub-DivisionalMagistrate/TalukaMagistrate/ExecutiveMagistrate/ExtraAssistantCommissioner.
- b. Chief Presidency Magistrate /Addl.Chief Presidency Magistrate/Presidency Magistrate.
- c. Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar.
- d. Sub-Divisional Officer of the area where the Candidate and/ or his family normally resides.
- e. Administrator/Secretary to the Administrator/Development Officer (Lakshadweep Islands).

Candidates to note that the SC / ST Certificate **from any other person / authority shall not be accepted in any case. If the Candidate happens to belong to SC or ST, Candidate's caste / tribe must be listed in the appropriate Govt. of India Schedule.**

It is a statutory obligation on the part of Departments/ Colleges to fill all seats reserved for Scheduled Caste/ Scheduled Tribe Candidates.

Departments/ Colleges/Institutes/Centers shall not refuse admission to any SC / ST Candidate on the basis of medium of instruction. Any deficiency in the knowledge of any particular language should be addressed; for this purpose, remedial classes may be arranged by the Department/ College by utilizing grants available from University Grants Commission.

RESERVATION OF SEATS FOR OTHER BACKWARD CLASSES (OBC, NON-CREAMY LAYER)

27% of seats are reserved for Candidates belonging to Other Backward Classes (OBC-Non-CreamyLayer,Central List).

At the time of giving admission to an OBC Candidate, the Department/Institute/Centre will ensure that the caste is included in the Central List of OBC (the OBC status is to be determined on the basis of the Central List of OBCs (Govt. of India) notified by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment on the recommendations of the National Commission for Backward Classes(availableatthewebsite<http://ncbc.nic.in/backward-classes/index.html>.)

The certificate must mention non-creamy layer status of the Candidate (Non-creamy layer status issued by an authority mentioned in DOPT Office Memorandum no. 36012/22/93-Estt.(SCT)dated15.11.1993).

The OBC Candidates who belong to the 'Non-Creamy Layer' and **whose caste appears in the Central List of the OBCs only**, shall be eligible to be considered for admission under the OBC category (Validity period of OBC certificate in respect of 'non-creamy layer' status of the Candidates as per DOPT Office Memorandum No. 36036/2/2013-Estt.(Res-I) dated 31 March 2016).The certificate should be issued after 31st March, 2023.

It is a statutory obligation on the part of Departments/ Centres/Institute to fill all the seats reserved for OBC Candidates.

RESERVATION POLICY FOR ECONOMICALLY WEAKER SECTIONS (EWS)

As per the University of Delhi notifications (Reference No. Aca. I / Reservation of EWSs / 2019/ 63 Dated 28th March 2019 and Reference No. Aca. I / Reservation of EWSs / 2019 / 101 Dated 15th May 2019), for the reservation for Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) Category, the University Departments/ Centres /Institute have reserved 10%seatsforadmissionofcandidatesbelongingtoEWScategory. The certificate should be issued after 31st March,2023.

ADMISSION TO SUPERNUMERARY SEATS

Admission to all supernumerary seats will be through Merit percentage obtained in the qualifying degree examination.

PERSONS WITH BENCHMARK DISABILITIES (PwBD)

Five percent (5%) of the total sanctioned strength in each Program are reserved for PwBD candidates.

The eligibility and details related to disabilities earmarked for PwBD category are stated in PG BOI 2023. Separate Merit List/s will be declared for candidates seeking admission under PwBD quota. For the prescribed format of PwBD certificate, refer to Annexure II. Disability Certificates issued after 01.06.2021 must be as per the Gazette Notification no. 1736 (E) dated 05.05.2021 issued by the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities and applied through UDID portal. However, Disability Certificates issued before 01.06.2021, will be considered as per other existing applicable rules and notifications of the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities and the University of Delhi. As per the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016, a 'person with benchmark disability means a person with not less than forty percent (40%) of a specified disability where specified disability has not been defined in measurable terms and includes a person with disability where specified disability has been defined in measurable terms, as certified by the certifying authority'. It may be noted that the erstwhile Persons with Disabilities (Equal Opportunities, Protect of Rights and Full Participation) Act, 1995 (No. 1 of 1996), under which reservation for Persons with Disabilities in admissions was provided earlier has now been repealed. Person with benchmark disabilities falling within any of the following specified categories of disabilities as mentioned in the Schedule to the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 [See Clause (zc) of Section 2 of the said Act] are eligible to get the benefit of the said reservation.

A. Locomotor Disability

Locomotor disability (a person's inability to execute distinctive activities associated with movement of self and objects resulting from affliction of musculoskeletal or nervous system or both), including—

1. **"Leprosy cured person"** means a person who has been cured of leprosy but is suffering from—
 - i) loss of sensation in hands or feet as well as loss of sensation and paresis in the eye and eye-lid but with no manifestation of deformity;
 - ii) manifest deformity and paresis but having sufficient mobility in their hands and feet to enable them to engage in normal economic activity;
 - iii) extreme physical deformity as well as advanced age which prevents him/her from undertaking any gainful occupation, and the expression "leprosy cured" shall construed accordingly;

2. "**Cerebral Palsy**" means a Group of non-progressive neurological condition affecting body movements and muscle coordination, caused by damage to one or more specific areas of the brain, usually occurring before, during or shortly after birth;
3. "**Dwarfism**" means a medical or genetic condition resulting in an adult height of 4 feet 10 inches (147 centimeters) or less;
4. "**Muscular Dystrophy**" means a group of hereditary genetic muscle disease that weakens the muscles that move the human body and persons with multiple dystrophy have incorrect and missing information in their genes, which prevents them from making the proteins they need for healthy muscles. It is characterized by progressive skeletal muscle weakness, defects in muscle proteins, and the death of muscle cells and tissue;
5. "**Acid Attack Victims**" means a person disfigured due to violent assaults by throwing of acid or similar corrosive substance.

B. Visual Impairment

6. "**Blindness**" means a condition where a person has any of the following conditions, after best correction
 7. total absence of sight; or
 8. visual acuity less than 3/60 or less than 10/200 (Snellen) in the better eye with best possible correction; or
 9. limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 10 degree.
10. "**Low-Vision**" means a condition where a person has any of the following conditions, namely:
 11. visual acuity not exceeding 6/18 or less than 20/60 upto 3/60 or upto 10/200 (Snellen) in the better eye with best possible corrections; or
 12. limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 40 degree upto 10 degree.

C. Hearing Impairment

13. "**Deaf**" means persons having 70 DB hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears;
14. "**Hard of Hearing**" means person having 60 DB to 70 DB hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears;
15. "**Speech and Language Disability**" means a permanent disability arising out of conditions such as laryngectomy or aphasia affecting one or more components of speech and language due to organic or neurological causes.

D. Intellectual Disability

A condition characterised by significant limitation both in intellectual functioning (reasoning, learning, problem solving) and in adaptive behaviour which covers a range of every day, social and practical skills, including—

16. "**Specific Learning Disabilities**" means a heterogeneous group of conditions wherein there is a deficit in processing language, spoken or written, that may manifest itself as a difficulty to comprehend, speak, read, write, spell, or to do mathematical calculations and includes such conditions as perceptual disabilities, dyslexia, dysgraphia, dyscalculia, dyspraxia and developmental aphasia;
17. "**Autism Spectrum Disorder**" means a neuro-developmental condition typically appearing in the first three years of life that significantly affects a person's ability to communicate, understand relationships and relate to others, and is frequently associated with unusual or stereotypical rituals or behaviors.

E. Mental Illness

"**Mental illness**" means a substantial disorder of thinking, mood, perception, orientation or memory that grossly impairs judgment, behaviour, capacity to recognize reality or ability to meet the ordinary demands

of life, but does not include retardation which is a condition of arrested or incomplete development of mind of a person, specially characterized by subnormality of intelligence.

F. Disability caused due to Chronic neurological conditions, such as—

18. "**Multiple Sclerosis**" means an inflammatory, nervous system disease in which the myelin sheaths around the axons of nerve cells of the brain and spinal cord are damaged, leading to demyelination and affecting the ability of nerve cells in the brain and spinal cord to communicate with each other;
19. "**Parkinson's Disease**" means a progressive disease of the nervous system marked by tremor, muscular rigidity, and slow, imprecise movement, chiefly affecting middle-aged and elderly people associated with degeneration of the basal ganglia of the brain and a deficiency of the neurotransmitter dopamine.

G. Blood Disorder

20. "**Haemophilia**" means an inheritable disease, usually affecting only male but transmitted by women to their male children, characterized by loss or impairment of the normal clotting ability of blood so that a minor wound may result in fatal bleeding.
21. "**Thalassemia**" means a group of inherited disorders characterized by reduced or absent amounts of haemoglobin.
22. "**Sickle Cell Disease**" means a haemolytic disorder characterized by chronic anaemia, painful events, and various complications due to associated tissue and organ damage; "haemolytic" refers to the destruction of the cell membrane of red blood cells resulting in the release of haemoglobin.

H. Multiple Disabilities (more than one of the above specified disabilities)

Multiple disabilities including deaf blindness which means a condition in which a person may have combination of hearing and visual impairments causing severe communication, developmental, and educational problems.

I. Any other category as may be notified by the Central Government.

Concessional/waiver of fees in respect ofPwBD

- a. Candidates with physical disabilities pursuing various programs of study in the Faculties, Departments, Centres, and Institutions / Colleges of the University shall be exempted from payment of fees, including examination fee and other University fees, except Admission fee, subscription towards Delhi University students' Union and Identity Card fee(As per amendment to Ordinance X(4) of the University).
- b. PwBD Candidates who meet the merit for the unreserved category and will take admission in the unreserved category (UR) will pay the fee relevant for PwBD Candidate.
- c. As per the Executive Council Resolution No. 50 dated 03.11.2012, students with physical disabilities residing in different Hostels / Halls of the University are exempted from payment of all hostel fees and charges except refundable caution fee and the mess fees. Persons with Physical Disabilities who are students shall pay 50% of the Mess fee and the remaining 50% of their Mess Fee will be met by the University of Delhi. Similar norms are to be adopted by the Colleges in respect of PwBD Students residing in various hostels of the Colleges.
- d. PwBD students who are getting fellowships / financial assistance shall be exempted from payment of fees / charges / mess fees subject to the following conditions.

Value of Fellowship	Exemption of Fees waiver etc
Upto 3000/- per month	Feeswaiver+50% Mess Subsidy
3001/- to 8000/- per month	Fees waiver but no Mess Subsidy
8001/- and above per month	No fees waiver and no Hostel Subsidy

- e. Candidates must ensure that the PwBD certificate is in the name of the candidate and issued by a recognized Government Hospital, bearing duly attested photograph of the candidate.

CHILDREN/WIDOWS OF PERSONNEL OF THE ARMED FORCES (CW)

Five percent (5%) of seats are reserved for Candidates under this category in each program.

All such Candidates have to upload the Educational Concession Certificate (ECC) issued by **any of the following authorities** on the proper letter head:

- Secretary, Kendriya Sainik Board, Delhi.
- Secretary, Rajya Zila Sainik Board.
- Officer-in-Charge, Record Office.
- 1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate.
- Ministry of Home Affairs (For Police Personnel in receipt of Gallantry Awards)

No other format shall be permissible. Proofs of the CW category in the form of ID card of parent or dependent, Medical card, Ration card, CSD card, etc. are not admissible in lieu of certificate in correct format. The priority must be clearly mentioned in the certificate. Certificates that do not mention the relevant priority will not be considered*.

Admission may be offered to the Children/Widows of Personnel of the Armed Forces (**Priority I to IX**) including Para- Military Personnel (**only Priority I to V**), in the following order of preference:

Priority I	Widows/Wards of Defence personnel killed in action;
Priority II	Wards of Defence Personnel disabled in action and boarded out from service with disability attributable to military service;
Priority III	Widows/Wards of Defence Personnel who died while in service with death attributable to military service;
Priority IV	Wards of Defence Personnel disabled in service and boarded out with disability attributable to military service;

Priority V	Wards of Ex-servicemen and Serving personnel, including personnel of police forces who are in receipt of Gallantry Awards; Param Vir Chakra Ashok Chakra Maha Vir Chakra Kirti Chakra Vir Chakra Shaurya Chakra President's Police Medal for Gallantry/President Gallantry Medal for the fire services personnel Sena Medal (Gallantry), Nau Sena Medal (Gallantry), Vayu Sena Medal (Gallantry) Mention-in-Despatches Police Medal for Gallantry/Gallantry Medal for fire services
Priority VI	Wards of Ex-Servicemen.
Priority VII	Wives of: Defence personnel disabled in action and boarded out from service. Defence personnel disabled in service and boarded out with disability attributable to military service Ex-servicemen and serving personnel who are in receipt of Gallantry Awards.
Priority VIII	Wards of Serving Personnel
Priority IX	Wives of Serving Personnel

WARD QUOTA OF EMPLOYEES OF UNIVERSITY OF DELHI

Candidates desirous of taking admission under the Ward Quota of Employees of University of Delhi must upload relevant parent's employment certificate.

Admission to the wards of University and its College employees, both teaching and non-teaching will be done as per Academic Council resolution 9a&b dated 27.11.2020 and subsequent amendments thereof.

Candidate must upload a valid Employment Certificate issued by the due officials. The certificate must clearly mention the status of employment of the parent/s. Only the certificate uploaded at the time of the registration for PG Merit Based Admission 2023 will be considered. I-Card, Aadhar Card, or any other document will not be accepted.

ORPHANS QUOTA

The University of Delhi will be admitting two candidates (one male and one female) in each program of study, both at the Undergraduate and Postgraduate level. These two seats will be supernumerary.

The Council of the University further resolved that the expenditure incurred for admission and continuance of study of such students in the University or its Colleges shall be met from the University Welfare Fund or College Students' Welfare Fund, as the case may be, for admissions in the University or in the College. Candidate who wishes to seek admission under the orphan quota will have to upload certificate from a Govt. recognized Orphanage/Charitable Home or Death certificate of both the parents.

LIST OF DOCUMENTS REQUIRED

The Candidates shall be required to upload copies of relevant certificates/documents at the time of applying (as applicable) and produce the same certificates/documents in original at the time of physical verification at the Department/ Centre/ Institute.

2. Proof of Date of Birth or Class X Board Examination Certificate. The Date of Birth must match the details entered in the registration form.

5. OBC - Non-Creamy Layer Certificate (in the name of the Candidate) issued by the competent issuing authority, and wherein the caste is in the OBC Central List issued by <http://ncbc.nic.in>. The name of the candidate claiming reservation under OBC -Non-Creamy Layer must match with the name as it appears on his/her corresponding School Board qualifying certificate and in the registration form; similarly, the parents' names must match. The certificate must be issued after March 31, 2023. For format of the OBC-NCL certificate, refer to Annexure II.
6. EWS Certificate (in the name of the candidate) from the competent issuing authority certifying the candidate can claim reservation under this category. The name of the candidate claiming reservation under this category must match with the name that appears on his/her corresponding School Board qualifying certificate; similarly, his/her parents' names must match. Income certificate must be issued after March 31, 2023. Refer to Annexure II for the format of the certificate.
7. PwBD disability certificate should be in the name of the candidate issued by a recognized Government Hospital, bearing a photograph of the candidate (Refer to Annexure II for the prescribed format of the certificate). Disability Certificates issued after 01.06.2021 must be as per the Gazette Notification no. 1736 (E) dated 05.05.2021 issued by the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities and applied through UDID portal. However, Disability Certificates issued before 01.06.2021, will be considered as per other existing applicable rules and notifications of the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities and the University of Delhi. (Refer to Annexure II)
8. Candidates applying for the CW category must upload the Educational Concession Certificate (ECC), (in the name of the candidate) in the format wherein the Priority is clearly mentioned. (Refer to Annexure II for the format of the certificate).
9. Candidate who wish to seek admission under UoD Ward supernumerary quota must upload a valid employment certificate of his/her parent/s issued by the due officials. Only the employment certificate uploaded during the registration process will be considered. I-cards, Aadhar Card and/or any other document will not be accepted.

10. Candidate who wishes to seek admission under the orphans quota will have to upload certificate from a Govt. recognized Orphanage/ Charitable Home or Death certificate of both the parents.
11. Candidates who have not passed their qualifying degree from UoD will have to submit a Migration Certificate/ Undertaking of Migration Certificate/or Scanned copy of UoD ID (in case of students who have passed their qualifying degree from UoD) as per the eligibility criteria. (Refer to Annexure II for format of the Undertaking form).

Candidates shall be responsible for the quality and authenticity of the certificate they upload. Candidates must take utmost care to ensure the uploaded documents/certificates are authentic and accurate. Candidates will be responsible to produce documents/certificates as sought.

All certificates/documents will be returned to the candidate by the Department/ Centre/ Institute upon completion of any physical verification that may be required at a later stage. If the original certificates are not in English/Hindi, the English/Hindi version/translation of such certificates, duly certified by the Principal/Director or other competent authority of the last Institute attended, will be required during the verification of documents.
